4	Real Estate activities" as per Ind AS 108 "Operating Segments" specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act 2013.  During the year, in VIDA project, the company has not achieved threshold limit to recognise revenue in accordance with IND-AS 115 "Revenue from Contracts". Accordingly, the company has not recognised any revenue during the period. Further, the Company has incurred advertisement expenses amounting to Rs. 74.37 lakhs for the quarter and Rs 203.22 lakhs for the year and Sales Commission & Brokerage expenses amounting to Rs. 210.13 lakhs for the quarter and Rs.328.26 lakhs for the year towards the promotion and booking of the recent VIDA Project of the Company at GIFT City and the same have been recognised in the statement of Profit & Loss.

Independent Auditors report on the Quarterly and year to date audited Standalone Financial Results of Nila Spaces Limited pursuant to Regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosures Requirements) Regulation, 2015 (as amended)

To, Board of Directors of Nila Spaces Limited

## 1. Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Statement of Quarterly and year to date standalone financial results ("the statement") of Nila Spaces Limited (the 'Company'), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ('Listing Regulations'), including relevant circulars issued by the SEBI from time to time.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these standalone financial results:

- are presented in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- ii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable Indian accounting standards ('Ind AS') prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act'), read with relevant rules issued thereunder, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net loss for the quarter and net loss for the year, other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2023.

# 2. Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended ("the Act"). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the "Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results" section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial results under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

3. Responsibility of the management and those charged with the governance Standalone Financial Results

These quarterly financial results as well as the year-to-date standalone financial

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have been prepared on the basis of the standalone annual financial statements. The Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation and presentation of these financial results that give a true and fair view of the net loss for the quarter and for the year and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the company and the standalone statement of assets and liabilities and the standalone statement of cash flows in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulations 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, which have been used for the purpose of preparation of the standalone financial results by the Directors of the Company, as aforesaid.

In preparing the standalone financial results, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.
